Financial Summary through December 2017

Reminders

Income:

Total YTD Actual income: \$334,771 Budgeted YTD: \$376,259 2016 YTD: \$369,726

Expenses:

Total YTD Actual Expenses: \$336,125 Budgeted YTD: \$376,259 2016 YTD: \$356,914

Offerings through December total \$258,514 compared to \$281,727 for the same period in 2016 and the budget of \$289,033. Restricted Contributions for the World Hunger Appeal were paid. Facility Usage is about \$1,000 less than budget and last year. The council approved suspending rent payments from LIRS (\$455/month) for 4 months. In December, we were able to transfer \$10,000 back to the reserve fund so for the year we have transferred \$45,000 from the reserve fund, \$10,000 less than we budgeted.

Memorials

No Memorials received in January

In 2016, our financial plan for the large bequests that we received in 2015 & 2016 included giving 10%, \$34,000 to the Outreach committee to be part of our outreach ministry. This money resides in the MIF – Reserve Savings account and we transfer \$1,313 to the general fund quarterly as we pay our benevolences. This shows up on the Transfer from Reserves – Outreach line. In 2017, Outreach used \$5,226 for added partnership giving over and above the 10% Outreach budget based on our prior year giving. In 2018, the total increases to \$6,000 per year or \$1,500 per quarter.

The fourth quarter benevolences were paid in December per the budget.

For the year, Total Building Expenses are \$74,226 compared to our budget of \$80,150 and 2016 expenses of \$73,085. Included are expenses for repairs, insurance, utilities, and cleaning.

The balance in the building fund at the end of December is \$33,003. From September 1 through December 29, the building fund received \$19,280 earning us the matching grant of \$15,000 from the foundation. On December 29, we made a payment of \$19,000 against principle bringing, our loan balance to \$13,248.

Reports and Updates

They are hoping to have it ready by the next council meeting, so it can get approved. The call committee will submit it to the Senet. Tim has a call into Kottke to see when they could schedule a meeting with him after the council approves the minister profile. We are asking for 4 to 20 years of experience nothing lower than 4 and nothing over 20. Pastor Rick is going to look and see if they have strategy information and give it to the call committee. Alice is going to look for the strategic plan and give it to the committee.

Outreach Committee: This is what the outreach committee did with their leftover money. They gave \$200 to Beacon, \$167 to food pantries, \$200 to ELCA good gifts, and \$40.00 to ELCA good gifts that sends girls to school.

Personnel: We have a tempory replacement while Berhanu is on leave. We have hired Brian McGinis he started on Tuesday Jan 16th. He will be cleaning and minor repair and replacements and will do sidewalk shovel when we have snow.

Finance: Nothing to Report

Worship planning: Niki Wagner is the new chair and they are meeting was Thursday January 18th.

Building Fund: This was approved to move it building maintenance.

Building Maintenance: Harker came to figure out the heating issue. The broiler would be cut off, so they figured it was cause by MGE. We must manually reset when it gets too high or too low. Harker showed Pastor Rich on how to reset the broiler, so he will show Dick and Brian

Defibrillator: Victor will be working with Deb to get it ordered.

Senior Care Team: We have 2 people request to see Pastor Rich to come and visit them this month.

Community Ministry: Jill did a good job on Sunday presenting on what she is working on. Mosaic had a group visit from Workbird seminary.

Pastoral reflection: He just went over what he found out from Harker.

New Business: 2 reps are going to the Dells for the Youth Rep for Assembly. Victor and Barb M are going, and we are allowed up to 3 people. If any youth rep would like to go, please see Victor if you have any questions. This will be Saturday, May 5 and Sunday May 6.

Quarterly Meetings are Feb 11th, April 29th, July 22nd, November 11th and Annual meeting will be November 18th. **Announcements:** Barbie will set up a schedule for who going to do the announcements each week.
