### Financial Summary through March 2018

-----The third Sunday of each month we collect food items for area food pantries.

-----The third Sunday of each month we provide the evening meal for the homeless men's shelter at 7pm

-----Articles for the next month *Connections* are due by noon on the third Friday of the current month.

Total YTD Actual income: \$104,739

Budgeted YTD: \$85,375

2017 YTD: \$78,995

Total YTD Actual Expenses: \$91,593

Budgeted YTD: \$101,485

2017 YTD: \$93,296

Offerings through March are \$96,436 compared to \$50,598 for the same period in 2017. Envelope Offerings include one donation of \$50,000. Without this donation, we would be about \$5,000 behind 2017 giving. Last year we received a similar gift in April.

Our financial plan for the large bequests that we received in 2015 and 2016 included giving 10%, or \$34,000, to the Outreach committee to be part of our outreach ministry. This money resides in the MIF – Reserve Savings account and we transfer \$1,500 to the general fund quarterly as we pay our benevolences. These payments show up under Transfer from Reserves – Outreach. All benevolences were paid in March with the exception of the \$625 for Community Ministry. The Outreach Committee would like this portion of their budget to be used for supporting the LSS request for rent reduction.

Most expense categories are under budget. A few items to note: Website Maintenance \$700 is the down payment to Green Table Media for our website and Logo refresh. Brunch includes \$175 for dishwasher supplies. Computer Supplies & Expense includes \$1,500 for a new laptop for Kristie Halverson our director of music. Building Equipment Repair/Service includes two visits from Harker to restart equipment after MG&E turned off gas to the building, a new garbage disposal in the OTSC kitchen, clearing a frozen downspout and drain and scheduled inspection of the sprinkler and elevator.

The balance in the building fund at the end of March is \$36,692. At the direction of the council, this money will be available to the Building Maintenance Committee for expensive building repairs. The balance in the Community Ministry Fund is \$17,897. This amount will be transferred from the Checking account to the MIF – Reserve Savings account in April where it will earn interest. There will be about \$73,000 to restart the Community Ministry Project in the future.

The fire dep't was called, and the alarm company called everyone at St John's on the alarm company's contact list because Victor did not know the secret pass phrase. During a break in the council meeting, Pastor Rich discovered the secret pass-phrase. Dick Severson will call Dick Gundlach to get the contract list updated (replacing Marc Williamson with Dick Severson).

### Lutheran Social Services

After a motion, second, and discussion, the council passed the following resolutions regarding rent paid by LSS:

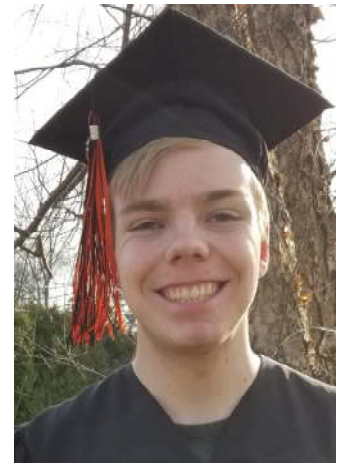
Reduce the rent for LIRS by half for the current year and the near future. No rent would be required for May thru August 2018. Beginning in September, only one half of the rent would be due as long as LIRS has only one person on staff at St. John's.

Rent for Off the Square Club shall be reduced by \$600 per month for May through October. Beginning in November, with the new lease, Off the Square Club would be expected to pay the rent according to the terms of the lease.

## May Council Minutes

#### Financial Summary through April 2018

Budgeted YTD:	\$122,997

Offerings through April are \$112,348 compared to \$105,430 for the same period in 2017. The 2018 budgeted amount is \$92,163. In 2017, we transferred \$20,000 from Reserves to meet our expenses. No transfers have been needed this year. Lent and Easter giving is \$3,062 compared to \$2,329 in 2017. The 2018 budget for this category is \$4,000.

LSS made the full rent payment in April for LIRS and Off the Square Club. At our March meeting, the council voted to reduce the rent for LIRS by half for the current year and the near future. No rent would be required for May thru August 2018. Beginning in September, only one half of the rent would be due as long as LIRS has only 1 person on staff at St. John's. Rent for Off the Square Club will be reduced by \$600 per month for May through October. Beginning in November, with the new lease, Off the Square Club will be expected to pay the rent according to the terms of a new lease. Our expected rent payment from LSS in May is \$1,065.

The Outreach benevolences of \$625 for Community Ministry was transferred to Miscellaneous Income for supporting the LSS rent reduction. Also included in Miscellaneous Income is \$631 from Thrivent.

A few expense items to note: Website Maintenance includes a \$1,068 payment to Green Table Media for the first draft of our website and Logo refresh. For our copier lease, there are two payments amounting to \$717 in April. No payment will be made in May. Building – New Equipment has \$1,546 for toilet replacement and repair in the basement bathrooms. Building Equipment Repair/Service has \$1,513 for two visits from Harker to investigate no heat complaints, reprogramming the elevator due to a power outage, and repayment to the Foundation of the remaining \$200 from the AED grant. In insurance, there is a \$402 refund of Worker's Comp insurance based on an annual audit.

The balance in the building fund at the end of April is \$37,264. At the direction of the council, this money will be available to the Building Maintenance Committee. The balance in the Community Ministry Fund is \$0, as \$17,897 was transferred from the Checking account to the MIF – Reserve Savings account in April where it will earn interest. We have about \$73,000 to restart the Community Ministry Project in the future.

#### REPORTS AND UPDATES

**Call:** Had another interview setup for Thursday May 17<sup>th</sup>. They are arranging for on-site interviews for the next round.

**Outreach Committee:** Having a meeting next Thursday May 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Personnel:** Deb Cook's last day was Friday May 11<sup>th</sup>. We have no bookkeeper as of right now. A job posting has been made. Alice sat with Deb to learn some of the details of the position and can help train the bookkeeper when he/she is hired. One option we have right now is for Alice to resign as treasurer as the congregation's book-keeper until a new person can be hired.

**Finance:** Budget planning will need to account for Deb's absence, and new finance policies and procedures may need to be instituted.

**Worship planning:** It has been suggested that assisting ministers may not have to wear robes during the summer. The robes themselves are somewhat ragged, and the worship planning committee is looking into getting new robes. The worship committee is also exploring a monthly service in an area park, with the first service possible occurring on June 20<sup>th</sup> at James Madison Park. Finally, new bread plates for communion have been ordered.

**Building Maintenance:** Dave Vogel, Peter Rafferty, Alice Gould, Dick Severson, Marsha Williamson are on the committee. They are creating a list of projects that need to be handled. Sprinkler inspections will be done after the road construction is complete (perhaps as soon as early July). Pricing for the stain glass repair and rebuilding the outside window covers came in at \$38,000. More bids are being sought.

**Senior Care Team:** We are visiting eight different shut in's every month. Special cards prepared by Barb Meyer are also being sent out.

**Pastoral reflection:** Two weeks ago, Pastor Rich attended the board meeting for Off the Square Club. They have been struggling financially and have been in conversation with county officials, who may expand county support dramatically. They are still waiting to hear back from the county, however to see what financial support will emerge. For now, Off the Square Club will remain open. The synod assembly went very well but was long (ending at 2:30 on Sunday rather than the usual 11 am end time). The installation of the new bishop will be in August.

**NEW AND OUTSTANDING BUSINESS:**

**Pipe Organ:** The pipe organ is in need of repair, since the last time the organ was worked on was when we remodeled the sanctuary. Casavant came in and looked over the organ and have now provided a run-down of repairs (but without any cost estimates). We are hoping to get some financial numbers from Casavant as well as additional estimates while Pastor Rich is here since he has in the past worked with other organ companies.

**Web site-** We have received a first draft, and a review is in progress.
